- Climate smart practices high tunnels & cover cropping
- Raising animals chickens & goats
- Specialty crop production growing mushrooms, cultural crops, & seed saving
- Farm Management physical resilience, wholesale, decision-making for vegetable production, & cottage food law

#### Two Special Speakers.

Afternoon Keynote Angela Dawson of 40 Acre Co-op shared her story about working with USDA and FSA programs and offered insights on alternative land and busines ownership models. Saturday morning opened with an address from Gloria Montaño Greene, Deputy Undersecretary for USDA's Farm Production and Conservation Mission area. She shared her experience as the daughter of an immigrant family, and the work she currently does addressing barriers for emerging farmers.

Intentional spaces to meet diverse needs. Extensive networking took place in an ongoing exhibit hall; in-depth technical assistance was provided in a 1:1 resource room; and attendees cared for themselves in dedicated wellness, prayer, and mother/baby rooms.
